### **Position Description**

The Department of Agricultural Studies invites applications for the Rolland Starn Endowed Chair in Agricultural Studies. The successful candidate will be hired into a 12-month appointment at the rank of Associate Professor or Professor with tenure, to serve as lead faculty member and Program Director for the Agricultural Studies program. The Rolland Starn Endowed Chair is expected to teach courses fundamental to the program, with emphasis on advanced courses in agricultural economics/agricultural business. Expected teaching duties: 15 credits of instruction during academic year (generally 2 courses per semester or equivalent). Endowed Chair responsibilities (equivalent to 9 credits): outreach and recruitment, student advising, fundraising and grant development, curriculum and program management and development, community and industry involvement, and other duties required to support a successful and sustainable Agricultural Studies program. This position includes summer employment

and responsibilities consistent with a 12-month appointment, including supervision of summer internships. Supplemental endowment earnings are available to support this position.

Doctorate required in Agricultural Economics, Agricultural Science, or any closely related field.

Demonstrated success with university-level teaching within the field, a record of scholarship appropriate for the position, and the demonstrated ability to build and maintain productive relationships with the practicing community.
