### **Position Description**

The University of Louisiana at Monroe invites applications for a tenure-track undergraduate position in agribusiness. The position is 100% teaching (12 credit hours per semester) at the rank of Assistant Professor. The position is a full-time, nine month, tenure-track undergraduate faculty position in the Agribusiness Program which is in the College of Business Administration at ULM.

The successful candidate should demonstrate strong interests and ability to teach courses in introductory agricultural economics, agribusiness management, agricultural finance, agricultural marketing,

agricultural accounting, agricultural policy, and natural resource economics. Further opportunities exist to teach during the short terms between fall and spring classes and spring and summer classes. Two summer terms also offer opportunities to teach additional classes.

The Agribusiness Program at ULM offers a Bachelor of Science Degree in Agribusiness which includes a minor in General Business. The Program is located in and administered by the College of Business Administration.

The successful candidate will be expected to continue the development of a program recognized regionally and nationally for successful teaching, research, and service. This would include developing an applied research program applicable to the agricultural economy of the region as well as working with many of the agricultural industries of Louisiana.
