The successful applicant will develop a nationally recognized research and teaching program in the general area of agricultural management and production economics. Engagement with undergraduate and graduate students is a high priority, including interest in teaching courses in agricultural management and production economics. Many opportunities exist to collaborate with both research and extension colleagues in developing applied research. The specific research emphasis area will be a function of both the candidate's area of interest and departmental needs, with integration between

research and extension programming expected. The successful applicant will be expected to 1) teach three courses per year, including two undergraduate courses and one graduate-level course; 2) provide quality advising to undergraduate and graduate students, including student clubs and competition teams; 3) publish research in peer-reviewed journals; 4) successfully seek extramural funding that includes graduate student funding; 5) participate in professional societies, conferences, and meetings; and 6) contribute to departmental, College, and University service needs. We anticipate filling this position at the Assistant Professor level, but will consider exceptional candidates for appointment as Associate Professor with tenure. Ph.D. in Agricultural Economics or Economics is preferred.
