Dr. James W. Richardson is a Co-Director of the Agricultural and Food Policy Center, Regents Professor in the Department of Agricultural Economics, and AgriLife Research Senior Faculty Fellow, at Texas A&M University. He has research and graduate teaching, responsibilities in public policy and simulation analysis. James joined Texas A&M in 1978 after completing a Ph.D. in Agricultural Economics at Oklahoma State University. He received a BS in Agricultural Economics at New Mexico State University and his MS in Agricultural Economics at Oklahoma State University.

His current research topics include 2008 farm bill implementation analyses, economics of ethanol and biodiesel production, fuel vs. food, water needs for the ethanol industry, changes in world trade due to biofuels production, and evaluation of alternative feed stocks for biofuels production. He is directing 10 Ph.D. and MS students and teaches two graduate risk courses each year.
