**Call for Papers: Virtual Special Issue of the American Journal of Agricultural Economics on the Economics of Inequity in Agricultural, Food, and Environmental Systems**

Government, industry, and non-profit leaders in agriculture and natural resources have growing interest in addressing problems of inequity in agricultural, food, and environmental systems. Large gaps exist in the economic research needed to inform those efforts, however. The Co-Editors of the AJAE are organizing a virtual special issue of research papers that fill important gaps in our knowledge about these issues.

We encourage scholars to submit original full-length research papers to the AJAE for publication that study novel questions about disparities related to marginalized people in agriculture, food, or natural resources and healthy environments. These papers must be original scholarly research (not literature reviews) but they need not necessarily provide causal evidence. A wide range of research methods are welcome, including descriptive analyses, as long as conclusions are strictly warranted by the work presented in the paper. At least one virtual

special issue will be published. If enough high-quality papers are submitted and accepted, multiple virtual special issues could be published on thematic subsets of this broader research agenda.

To qualify for expedited review, papers should be submitted to the AJAE by **July 21, 2023**. Papers submitted between then and December 15, 2023, will still be considered for virtual special issues but will not receive expedited review. Details regarding the submission and review process are:

- Submissions should go through the regular Editorial Express platform at <https://editorialexpress.com/cgi-bin/e-editor/e-submit.cgi?dbase=ajae>.
- Your cover letter should have a heading at the top that states “For Expedited VSI on Equity”.
- Note that by definition, an expedited review process will only accept papers that can be made ready for publication with limited revisions in a short amount of time. Papers that need multiple rounds of significant revisions will not be accepted through expedited review.
- If a Co-Editor decides the paper is not a good topical fit for the call, you may be given the chance to convert the submission to a regular AJAE submission.

Note: A paper does **not** need to have been presented at the Conference on Inequity in Agricultural, Food, and Environmental Systems to be considered for publication in the special issue(s).

### **Call for Special Issue - Fields of Discord: Understanding the Intersection of Geopolitics and Agriculture**

The relationship between geopolitics and agriculture is increasingly important as the world faces numerous challenges related to food security, climate change, and economic development. In addition, the competition for resources and the global interconnectedness of markets and economies make the relationship between geopolitics and agriculture complex and multifaceted. The special issue in *Applied Economic Perspectives and Policy* will bring together academic scholarship to explore the intersection of geopolitics and agriculture. Selected papers will discuss the challenges and opportunities this complex relationship presents, including the potential for conflict and tension arising from competing interests and priorities considering economic, social, and environmental aspects. The special issue will examine how agricultural practices intersect with global politics, from land use and resource management to trade policies and food security. The guest editors encourage paper submissions addressing the following topics:

- Geopolitical factors influencing food and agricultural policies;
- The role of geopolitics in agricultural trade and economic development;
- The impact of climate change on agriculture and its geopolitical implications; and
- The effects of migration on agriculture and food systems.

The special issue will comprise six papers and an editorial paper. A two-stage selection approach will be implemented, where, in the first stage, potential contributors are identified through the 2023 IATRC summer symposium. Then, extended abstract submissions (750 words) for the special issue are requested with a due date on August 1, 2023. Based on the submitted extended abstracts, the guest editors will identify papers that best fit the call and invite those for full consideration. Selected papers will be sent out for rigorous double-blind peer review per the AEPP submission guidelines, with a submission deadline of **September 30, 2023**. Two rounds of peer reviews are planned, with the themed special issue to be published in May 2024.

## Government Relations & Washington Update

### July 2023

#### House and Senate Committees Advance FY 2024 Agriculture Spending Bill

On June 14, the House Appropriations Committee met to consider the FY 2024 Agriculture Appropriations bill. The bill provides a non-defense discretionary total of \$25.313 billion for programs under the jurisdiction of the Subcommittee, \$532 million (2.1%) below the FY23 enacted level and \$3.622 billion (12.5%) below the FY24 President's Budget Request. The bill was allocated \$17.838 billion and includes another \$7.475 billion that is offset by clawing back unused funding for pandemic-era programs.

On June 22, the Senate Appropriations Committee approved its version of FY 2024 Agriculture Appropriations. The Senate's bill provides \$25.993 billion which represents a slight increase over FY 2023 levels, but \$3 billion below the President's request. The Senate bill does not cancel unused pandemic funding as was done in the House version.

#### House Subcommittee Holds Farm Bill Hearing on the Research Title

On June 14, the House Agriculture Committee's Subcommittee on Conservation, Research, and Biotechnology held a hearing entitled: "[A Review of Title VII: University Perspectives on Research and Extension Programs.](#)" In

his opening statement, Subcommittee Chairman, Rep. Jim Baird (R-IN), noted how agricultural research has yielded the economy \$20 for every \$1 spent despite public spending for agricultural research declining since 2002. Baird also acknowledged the backlog of deferred maintenance on research facilities across the nation. The Subcommittee heard from a panel of witnesses representing a cross section of land grant and non-land grant universities. Support for infrastructure was a common theme, as was continued authorization and funding for capacity funds and competitive programs.

### Legislation Introduced to Fund Agricultural Research Infrastructure

On June 14, Representatives Tracey Mann (KS-01) and Kim Schrier (WA-08) introduced [H.R. 4135, the Augmenting Research and Educational Sites to Ensure Agriculture Remains Cutting-edge and Helpful \(AG RESEARCH\) Act](#). This legislation will bolster federal investment in land-grant universities, institutions, and facilities that conduct food and agricultural research. The bill would provide \$1 billion in mandatory spending and authorize an additional \$1 billion in discretionary appropriations over 5 years to provide infrastructure grants to agricultural research facilities. The hope is that the AG RESEARCH Act can be incorporated into the next Farm Bill. The legislation would support the Association of Public and Land-Grant Universities (APLU) ongoing efforts to secure additional funds for agricultural research infrastructure.

### Call for Papers: Special Issue of the *Agricultural Finance Review* on the Farm Bill

The guest editors for a special issue of the *Agricultural Finance Review* on “New Developments in U.S. Agricultural Lending: Implications for Federal Farm Bill Programs” invite authors to submit articles for consideration. This issue aims to provide timely insights into how the current agricultural credit and financial landscape is relevant for ongoing discussions about the next Farm Bill cycle, which begins this year. This special issue will advance knowledge on agricultural lending and related topics that can inform the upcoming Farm Bill and agricultural policy more generally. We intend to achieve this goal by publishing papers on diverse topics with connections to agricultural lending and policy, including labor, trade, and finance. The focus should be on relating those topics to recent changes that have occurred in the agricultural credit and financial landscape from 2018 onwards, including evaluation of government programs. Novel analyses of agricultural lending that are relevant to agricultural policy would also be suitable.

### **Water Economics and Policy Journal: Call for Papers for a Special Issue**

#### **Special Issue on Economic Impact of Climate Change on the Water Sector in MENA and Northern Mediterranean Countries**

Climate change in MENA countries as well as Northern Mediterranean countries (Portugal, Spain, Italy, Cyprus, Greece, and Southern France) has already made an evident impact affecting rain-fed agriculture as well as surface water reservoirs, aquifers' natural recharge and cities. Crop varieties and tree species currently under cultivation in the Southern Mediterranean would progressively be appropriate in the North Mediterranean farming systems for adaptation. Rain is becoming more sporadic and more intensive with fewer number of rainy days, higher temperatures, and longer summer months, leading to crop area shrinkage and increased need for water desalination. Hence, the increased water scarcity is affecting all the economic sectors (agriculture, water utilities, industry, tourism, and the environment) and driving a higher demand for water, including for adaptation purposes. Domestic urban and rural water are under increased stress/variability and water service failures/interruptions are becoming more frequent causing social discontent. Although quantitative technical-physical climate impacts are quite abundant, the lack of economic value tags attached to such studies makes them less valuable for policy consideration and undertaking the necessary shifts and adaptations. Previous economic impact studies based their adaptation measures on deficit irrigation for instance, however data is showing that aquifers are under high stress and cannot be used for such a purpose. Similarly, surface water reservoirs' storage capacity is negatively affected by siltation caused by the more torrential sporadic intensive rains reducing the supply of water and increasing the supply uncertainty. This special issue of Water Economics and Policy aims to bridge this gap.

**Potential topics/issues include, but are not limited to:**

- Assessing the economic losses caused by extreme events (droughts; floods; extreme temperatures) on water for cities and agriculture;
- Economic impact of climate change on rain-fed and irrigated agriculture and adaptation measures;
- Economic impact of climate change on dams' storage capacity based on observations (during the period 1990-2022). Dams' siltation and water value taking into account rain intensity and periodicity;
- Adaptation measures and investments in the water sector as a response to climate change;
- Impacts of climate change on water policies and institutions;
- MENA and Northern Mediterranean countries' policy adaptation measures and investments undertaken in the past 20 years in the water/agricultural sectors;
- Case studies of successful adaptation strategies in the water sector;
- International programs and international aid and their effect on water sector adaptation to climate change on the MENA region;
- Assessment of the European programs oriented toward water sector climate adaptation for Northern and Southern Mediterranean countries; and
- Investments in R&D for water climate adaptation.

Manuscript submission deadline (via Editorial Manager): **July 31, 2023**.

All submitted papers are expected to fully comply with Water Economics and Policy journal standards and are subject to regular review procedures. Papers should not have been published previously in any other journal (print or electronic format). Dr Slim Zekri is Professor in the Dept. Nat. Res. Econ. at Sultan Qaboos University. He earned his PhD in Ag.

Econ. and Quantitative Methods from the University of Cordoba, Spain. His main research interests are in Water Economics & Policy, Agricultural Economics and Environmental Economics. In 2017 he won the Research and Innovation Award in Water Science from the Sultan Qaboos Higher Center for Culture & Science. He is Associate Editor of the journal of Water Economics and Policy. He worked as a consultant for a range of national and international agencies. He is member of the Scientific Advisory Group of the FAO's Globally Interesting Agricultural Heritage Systems since 2018. In 2020 he edited a book titled Water Policy in MENA Countries published by Springer.
