# Virtual: AEM/Graduate Student Section Case Study Competition

The Agribusiness Economics and Management/Graduate Student Section Case Study Competition allows graduate students to test their communication skills and their ability to apply their knowledge of agricultural economics and agribusiness subjects to practical situations. Students competing in the competition will receive a copy of the case study at least three weeks in advance of the competition.

Competition Rules: Each team should prepare an oral summary of their solution to the case that will last no more than 15 minutes. The presentation must be recorded and submitted in advance for evaluation. Presentations lasting over 15 minutes will be penalized. Teams will meet the judges (virtually) and should be prepared to answer questions from the evaluators on their interpretation of the case.

Teams can be comprised of up to three graduate students. Students may either compete as a team from the same school, or may choose to be mixed with students from other schools. If there is only one student from a

school that wants to participate, the student can compete on his/her own or he/she can be matched with other students. In the case of teams that are matched with individuals from different universities, competitors will be notified of their teammates as soon as possible, but no later than the same day the case is announced.

Competition Prizes: The top three teams will receive plaques and cash prizes.

First Place: \$300Second Place: \$200Third Place: \$100

Specific Information for the 2020 Case Study Competition (Virtual): The number of rounds will be determined by the number of teams entered. The final round will be composed of the top four teams. In addition to plaques and cash prizes, the three finalist teams will also be recognized in the AAEA Website.

# 2020 AAEA Mentoring Research Workshop Rescheduled dates: October 7-9, 2020

As we look ahead to the 2020/21 academic year, we begin to imagine how to successfully adapt courses for online delivery, while continuing to offer learning experiences for our students that are as high quality as possible. Similar challenges are also facing those of us working in extension. Building on the success of the 2020 *NSE* special issue, the 2021 special issue of "*Natural Sciences Education in a COVID-19 World*" will explore our collective experiences with adapting to COVID-19. We encourage contributions on the following topics:

- Ideas, approaches and case studies on how to address the need to move courses online (relevant to both K-12 and higher education).
- Strategies to deal with various administrative challenges in higher education.
- Issues facing extension specialists in reaching out to farmers.

# Free Commentary: Economic Impacts of COVID-19 on Food and Agricultural Markets

This paper examines the many economic factors and impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic, with a focus on the agriculture sector. In efforts to slow down the spread of COVID-19, many states and countries shut down several economic areas such as tourism and entertainment venues, restaurants, personal services, and some manufacturing facilities. This has led many areas into a recession. The authors of this paper examine the effects this recession has on these topics: macroeconomics; trade; supply chain; consumer behavior; food service/grocery; meat processing; forestry and wood products; local food systems; food waste; food insecurity; major commodity crops; agricultural finance; agricultural labor; rural health care; and research and outreach priorities.
