President's Column



May 2025

I want to recognize that the last few months have been difficult for many of our members. Some have lost their jobs and others have lost funding for projects years in the making. Long run plans have been upended and the future is highly uncertain. The AAEA Board understands that current events may impact folks' ability to stay engaged with AAEA. We are actively working to find ways to help folks do so. I want to talk about a few of these.

The Board decided to charge a token registration fee to the 2025 Annual Meetings in Denver for members who have involuntarily lost employment in 2025 or have signed on to the Deferred Resignation program. In this way we hope to assist members who may have had their registration paid for by their employer, but are

either separated or are planning on separating in the coming months, to attend the meetings and connect with colleagues and friends.

In addition, working with Section leadership, we have increased the financial aid for members who have lost funding that might have allowed them to over the past year. As of this writing, we have allocated 33 travel grants to affected members. While demand for these Section grants exceeded available funds, we have done our best to prioritize funding for folks presenting papers at the meetings. If you would like to individually sponsor a travel grant, please reach out to me or <u>Jeanne Rhodes</u> and let us know. Between the travel grant and reduced registration, we hope to make attending the 2025 meetings affordable for folks who may now be paying out of pocket.

We are also working on plans for reduced membership fees for folks who have involuntarily lost employment in 2025 or have signed on to the Deferred Resignation program. While details will be announced after the annual meetings, the goal will be to minimize the burden of remaining part of AAEA. We value our membership and want to help folks stay connected.

Taking a step back, we are working with our Washington representative to communicate the value of our work to policy makers and advocate for programs on which we depend as a profession. We're focusing on preserving research funding streams, maintaining the data infrastructure on which we depend, supporting early-career professionals, and showing the value of our members' work to agriculture, food systems, and rural communities. I continue to believe that our work has never been more relevant or important. If you have the time, I would ask members to send us examples of work that has a direct impact on farmers and people

working in agriculture. Communicating impact in narrative form helps us show the value of our work during these difficult times.

2025 AAEA FAMPS Poster Competition

FAMPS proposes to host a poster session at the 2025 Annual Meeting, similar to the one hosted at the 2024 meeting. The objective of the poster session is to provide a forum for researchers with more limited professional networks, like graduate students and beginning faculty, to be recognized for innovative and high-quality research in poster sessions. These researchers might be less likely to participate in track

sessions, and thus attend the annual meeting, than researchers with stronger professionally networks. This recognition could also be helpful to some researchers at the beginning stages of their career.

The details for the poster session are the following:

- FAMPS will provide three awards:
 - o Two (2) \$250 prizes for the best posters in which the lead author is a graduate student
 - o One (1) \$250 prize for the best poster in which the lead author has a doctorate degree
- Requirements: The lead author for each submission must be a FAMPS member and must attend the 2025 AAEA & WAEA Joint Annual Meeting in-person.
- Submissions: AAEA will send notifications of accepted posters in March. Once this occurs, FAMPS will
 communicate in late March/early April to those with accepted posters they can participate in the FAMPS
 poster contest.
- Judging: FAMPS leadership will identify three researchers to judge the competition.
- Logistics: The poster competition judging will occur on Monday during the lunch break from 11:30am
 1:00pm in the poster hall. Posters accepted in the FAMPS competition will have a symbol/tag on their poster board.

The deadline to apply is May 30, 2025.

Undergraduate Student Section 2025 Competitions

1. The Earl O. Heady Decision Sciences Spreadsheet Competition

The Earl O. Heady Decision Sciences competition is a team-based competition where students show off their Excel skills in a time-limited analytical contest! Each team of up to three students entering the Earl O. Heady Decision Sciences Spreadsheet Competition is required to work together to develop a spreadsheet from a provided dataset and qualitative information, answer questions related to the dataset, and present findings from the case study.

2. Student Paper Competition

Undergraduate students have the opportunity to submit their paper to be part of the Student Paper Competition held each year at the AAEA Annual Meeting. Those papers submitted are judged based on the written version and an oral presentation given at the meeting.

3. Outstanding Paper Competition

This competition gives chapters of SS-AAEA the chance to be recognized for their hard work over the past year. Each chapter is judged based on the goals/objectives of the chapter, membership recruitment, and the activities of the chapter.

4. Creative Club Competition

Those chapters of SS-AAEA that have done something special over the past year can enter into this competition. The chapters will be judged based on their account of a specific idea or project that was implemented.

2025 AEM- GSS CASE STUDY COMPETITION

The Agribusiness Economics and Management (AEM) – Graduate Student Section (GSS) Case Study Competition allows graduate students to test their communication skills and their ability to apply their knowledge of agricultural economics and agribusiness to practical situations.

Competition Rules and Timeline: Each team must complete the 2025 AEM-GSS Case Study Registration Form by June 13, 2025. Teams can be comprised of up to three graduate students. Students may either compete as a team from the same university or partner with students from other universities. If there is only one student from a university that wants to participate, the student can compete on their own; or they can be matched with other students. In the case of teams that are matched with individuals from different universities, competitors will be notified of their teammates as soon as possible, and no later than the same day the case is announced.

The case will be sent to teams in mid–July, and teams will be given approximately two weeks to prepare a 15-minute oral summary of their solution to the case. The competition will take place on Sunday, July 27, 2025 coinciding with the AAEA Annual Meeting set to take place in Denver, CO. Teams will present their case to a panel of judges with expertise in agribusiness management. Judges will then be allotted time to ask questions, and teams will be judged based on a grading rubric that will be provided to teams when the case is sent in July. There will be two rounds to the competition. In the first round, judges will hear from all teams and select the top three teams as finalists. After this announcement, the finalists will present their case to a new panel of judges.

A summary of the competition's preliminary timeline is presented below.

- Case sent to team: Friday, July 13 by 5:00 pm EDT
- Case Study Competition: Sunday, July 27, 8:00 am 1:30 pm EDT*
- Case Study Finals: Sunday, July 27, 1:30 pm 4:30 pm EDT*

Competition Prizes: The top three teams will receive plaques, cash prizes, and will be recognized at the AAEA Award Ceremony. The cash prizes are as follows:

First Place: \$500Second place: \$400Third place: \$300

Call for Paper Proposal for Special Issue: Food Prices and Forecasting

Deadline for proposals: May 15, 2025 - TODAY

Applied Economic Perspectives and Policy (AEPP) invites proposals for a special issue on Food Prices and Forecasting. Recent global events such as the COVID-19 pandemic, geopolitical disruptions, and climate variability have highlighted the importance of understanding food price dynamics and developing effective forecasting methodologies. This special issue will explore a range of topics related to the drivers, impacts, and policy implications of food price inflation and volatility.

The special issue will include two categories of papers: invited contributions (already in development) and solicited papers based on this call. We seek five additional contributions that complement the existing papers, addressing the following topic areas:

- 1. Global Trade and Trade Policy
- 2. Climate Change and Production
- 3. Policy Interventions and Price Stabilization
- 4. Energy and Transportation Costs in Food Pricing
- 5. Manufacturers' Responses to Price Fluctuations
- 6. Consumer Behavior and Responses to Price Changes
- 7. Food Security and Nutrition Security

Submission Process

To streamline the process and avoid unnecessary work for prospective authors, we will employ a two-step process:

- 1. Proposal Submission:
- Interested authors are invited to submit a 2-4 page proposal by May 15, 2025, detailing:

- Topic Area and Scope: The central theme of the paper and its relevance to the special issue.
 Please indicate which topic area, from the list above, your submission fits within.
 Note: Submissions that do not fit within the aforementioned topic areas will not be considered.
- Existing Literature: Reference to related papers and how the proposed paper will differ from prior work.
- o Policy Implications: Policy insights expected from the paper and potential research gaps to address.
- o Author Qualifications: A brief overview of the author(s)' expertise in the topic area.
- Proposals should be submitted as a single PDF to <u>Lauren.Chenarides@colostate.edu</u>. The guest editors will review all submissions, and invitations to submit full papers will be sent by June 2, 2025.
- 2. Full Paper Submission
- Invited authors will be given four months to prepare their submissions, with a deadline of September 15, 2025. Full papers will undergo standard peer review. An invitation to submit does not guarantee acceptance for publication but confirms the topic and authors are of interest to the editors.

AAEA at 2026 ASSA Annual Meeting

Call for submissions: AAEA invited paper sessions at the 2026 ASSA Annual Meeting

President-Elect Brian Roe is soliciting proposals and suggestions for AAEA invited paper sessions at the 2026 Allied Social Sciences Association (ASSA) Annual Meeting in Philadelphia, PA, January 3-5, 2026.

The objective of AAEA sessions at the ASSA Annual Meeting is to share new knowledge of interest to economists. The AAEA encourages sessions that will draw widely from ASSA attendees, including sessions jointly sponsored with other ASSA member associations.

A subcommittee of the AAEA Board will review all proposals. Preference will be given to proposals that

- 1. Cover issues of national and international importance,
- 2. Expand capabilities and tools for economic research,
- 3. Promise a high-quality collection of papers suitable for publication.

Papers in approved Invited Paper sessions are eligible to be peer reviewed for publication in the proceedings issue of the *Applied Economic Perspectives and Policies*. Authors will be contacted by the *AEPP* editors with manuscript submission details.

Proposed formats for the 2-hour sessions may include either three papers with one discussant or else four papers with no discussant. All proposals must include a plan for fostering participant interaction.

Proposals should include the session title and paper titles, as well as the names, addresses, phone numbers, and e-mail addresses of the session organizer, moderator, paper presenters, and discussants. Proposal text should begin with a short justification of the session, followed by one paragraph abstracts describing the objective and contributions of each paper. The organizer is responsible for ensuring that all individuals identified in the proposal are willing to participate.

All speakers and discussants must be members of AAEA, although the proposal may request a membership waiver under special circumstances. Participants must register for the ASSA meeting.

To promote research on the risks that are borne by individuals and firms in the agricultural sector, and on the tools that are available to manage these risks, the National Bureau of Economic Research (NBER), with the support of the Economic Research Service at the US Department of Agriculture, will convene a research conference in Cambridge, MA on Friday, November 21, 2025. The conference will be organized by Barry Goodwin (North Carolina State University) and Tatyana Deryugina (University of Illinois and NBER).

The organizers will consider submissions of complete, or nearly complete, papers that will be ready to present by November 2025. They welcome empirical and theoretical research, as well as papers by scholars who are early in their careers and who are not NBER affiliates. If any members of the research team have ties to the agricultural industry or other potential conflicts of interest, those ties should be disclosed on the first page of the submission. The program will prioritize research on the US food and farm economy.

Please do not submit papers that have been accepted for publication and will be published by November 2025, and be aware that NBER papers may not make policy recommendations or offer normative judgements on policy. Authors chosen to present papers will be notified in early September. The NBER will cover hotel and economy-class conference travel for up to two authors per paper.
