Citations to all documents in AgEcon Search are harvested by RePEc and the Author Service maintains a publication list from which your monthly e-mail is generated. To get started, go to https://authors.repec.org/ to register.

- 2. Reply to the confirmation e-mail that will be sent to you shortly afterwards

CFARE DC Update

FY 2015 Senate Appropriations Bills - Commerce, Justice, and Science, and Agriculture

Senate Appropriators have not yet given up on moving the minibus (HR 4660), which incorporates the fiscal 2015 Commerce–Justice–Science (S 2437), Transportation–HUD (S 2438) and Agriculture (S 2389) measures. The spending bills are ready for Senate floor consideration, but are under a tight timetable due to a limited number of legislative days in July. Last week, leaders struggled with gridlock related to attempts to get unanimous consent to combine the multiple measures into one legislative vehicle (minibus). Legislators are trying to avoid a continuing resolution come Oct. 1.

CFTC Authorization Bill

On June 24, Chairman Frank Lucas of Oklahoma celebrated the passage of the <u>Customer Protection</u> and <u>End-User Relief Act of 2014 H.R. 4413</u> by the U.S. House of Representatives (265–144). The Senate Agriculture Committee will not vote on legislation to reauthorize the Commodity Futures Trading Commission for at least several more weeks, Chairwoman Debbie Stabenow said according to CQ Roll Call.

Congressional Quarterly's Phil Brasher Hosting Webinar on Ag. Appropriations

The Webinar will occur on July 8th @ 1PM. CQ Agriculture Blog Editor Phillip Brasher and reporter Georgina Gustin will be discussing the 2015 appropriations process and how it's playing out for agriculture and food policy. They will discuss the latest on the implementation of the farm bill and the forecast for other hot regulatory issues, including: school nutrition, the Clean Water Act, immigration policy, GMO labeling and regulation, implementation of the Food Safety Modernization Act, poultry

inspection, food aid policy, and trade negotiations. Register <u>here</u>.

In Other DC News

Sen. Thad Cochran defeated tea party challenger this past Tuesday. Cochran is now the ranking member on the Senate Agriculture Committee, where he has been a passionate defender of nutrition programs and southern agricultural interests. Senator Cochran would take over as chairman of Appropriations should he win re-election and Republicans take control of the Senate in November.

Chairman and CEO of Cargill Inc., Greg Page and others released a new report called 'Risky Business' that highlights the economic impacts of climate change on industry. The report says that 'productivity gains in Northern-tier states from shifting agricultural patterns and crop yields will likely be offset by losses in the Midwest and South.'

The Farm Foundation and the Noble Foundation have just completed the 'Soil Renaissance Strategic Plan' with input from thought leaders working in production agriculture, agribusiness, the academic community, NGOs and government agencies. The Soil Renaissance Strategic Plan outlines goals and work plans in four key areas: Measurement, Economics Research and Education.

The award recipients participated in a two-day program in Washington, DC, June 19-20, 2014. The program exposed the young leaders to federal agencies and funding opportunities. Awardees also had the opportunity to perform visits with congressional members and staff after participating in a science policy communications training. Congratulations to Drs. David Ortega of Michigan State University; Juan Sesmero from Purdue University; Kelly Grogan from University of Florida; Nathan Hendricks of Kansas State University; Lisa Elliott, South Dakota State University; and Tyler Mark of the University of Kentucky.

"C-FARE provides the award to outstanding professionals who have an interest in communicating the science of agricultural and applied economics. Receiving the award early in their career will allow them to enhance their ability to network and more effectively tailor their research, teaching, and outreach programs to address policy-relevant issues", said C-FARE Vice-Chairwoman, Dr. Mary Ahearn.

All of the recipients met with congressional staff, and a few with members of Congress. Dr. Tyler Mark had the opportunity to meet Congressman Andy Barr (R KY-6) to describe his work with the agricultural sector related to the renewable fuel standard, as well as his research evaluating telematics and big data.

"It was a pleasure meeting Dr. Mark", said Congressman Andy Barr (R KY-6). "The research that the University of Kentucky performs in agricultural economics is a key factor in understanding what risks exist for the adoption of new cropping systems and technologies. I look forward to continue working with Dr. Mark, the University of Kentucky and my Agriculture Coalition to promote Kentucky's signature agriculture industry."

Call for IAAE Secretary-Treasurer

Walt Armbruster plans to continue to serve as <u>IAAE</u> Secretary–Treasurer until the August, 2014 IAAE Board Meeting, at which he will officially resign. At that time, the Board will appoint someone to fulfill Walt's unexpired term, which ends at the conclusion of the 2015 International Conference of Agricultural Economists (ICAE).

Any IAAE member interested in serving as Secretary–Treasurer should submit an application, including a 300–500 word statement of their perspective on future opportunities and directions for the IAAE, by June 30, 2014 to IAAE@execinc.com. A curriculum vita should be attached. A decision to appoint a replacement for Walt will be made by the Board at its August, 2014 meeting. Subsequently, the IAAE Nominating Committee will include the appointed Secretary–Treasurer in its report to the Board on candidates for election to the Board for a three year term for vote by the members in early 2015. The Secretary–Treasurer may subsequently be nominated for successive 3–year terms.

From September 2014, Walt will continue as a consultant to IAAE through December 31, 2015 to work with the new Secretary-Treasurer to assure a smooth transition and complete follow up payments to grantees, reports to funders about grants made, and to wrap up other details associated with the 2015 ICAF.

The roles and duties of the Secretary-Treasurer are defined in the International Association of Agricultural Economists, Inc. Bylaws of 9-30-2013, Section 7.2.3:

"Secretary/Treasurer. The Secretary/Treasurer or their designee shall record the minutes of the meetings of the Board of Directors and the

Executive Committee in one or more books provided for that purpose; see that all notices are duly given in accordance with the provisions of these Bylaws or as required by the law; be custodian of the corporate records; and perform all duties incident to the office of Secretary/Treasurer. The Secretary/Treasurer shall also have supervision through the Office of the Executive Director of all monies, securities and other valuable properties of the Corporation and shall oversee accurate accounts of the receipts and disbursements of the Corporation in books belonging to it. The Secretary/Treasurer shall ensure that all monies and other valuable effects are deposited in the name and to the credit of the Corporation in such accounts and in such depositories as may be designated by the Board of Directors. The Secretary/Treasurer shall check monthly the disbursements of funds of the Corporation in accordance with authority of the Board of Directors. The Secretary/Treasurer shall render to the President and the Board of Directors whenever requested or otherwise required, a written detailed account of the transactions and of the financial condition of the Corporation, including a statement of all its assets, liabilities, and financial transactions. The Secretary/Treasurer shall perform such other duties as the Board of Directors, through the President, direct, and such other duties as usually pertain to

the office of Secretary/Treasurer."

In practice, the Secretary–Treasurer provides continuity as the other Board members rotate every three years; manages daily IAAE operations in collaboration with Executive Director, Inc., which maintains the membership database and the IAAE website, and provides financial services; oversees IAAE's fiduciary responsibilities; manages official communications, contracts and memoranda of understanding with local hosts of the triennial ICAE and inter–conference symposia; coordinates funding solicitation and subsequent reporting to funders through the Fund for the ICAE to support developing country participation in the ICAE; organizes the annual IAAE Board meetings in conjunction with the President;

initiates communications to members; and manages other items requiring IAAE attention.

Call for Co-Editor for Agricultural Economics

- Examine the impact of recent fluctuations in capital and commodity markets on the financial performance, credit availability, real estate values, and capital structure of farms, agribusinesses, and lenders in urban and rural communities.
- Evaluate the management strategies,

capital needs, and policy impacting the financial performance and long-term sustainability of firms in the food and agribusiness sector.

The NC-1177 executive committee and NACC are also seeking extension oriented presentations to be presented during the joint sessions. For consideration for the joint sessions, presentations will need to address one of the following topics:

- Policy outlook
- Risk management
- Water issues
- Income and asset values
- Data issues
- Loan repayment and debt issues
