



PC13 Workshop Travel Grant Stipend Application

A total of 10 travel grants of up to \$300 each will be awarded. Preference will be given to individuals who also **apply to present** at the workshop. We will invite 4-6 presenters, who will receive travel grants. The remaining travel grants will be awarded to other attendees. As the workshop covers applications of zTree and oTree, presenters are invited to talk about their work on projects using these software tools, with an emphasis on experimental design and programming.

To apply for travel grant, submit one paragraph (no more than 200 words) explaining why you should be considered for the stipend, and complete this application form. Include your name and email on the paragraph.

To apply to present: If you would also like to be considered for presenting in the workshop, submit a short abstract (no more than 200 words) of the work you want to present.

The amount of the stipend will not exceed \$300 and successful applicants will be reimbursed up to that amount for expenses related to attending the workshop. Advance workshop registration and attendance is required for reimbursement. A Travel Grant reimbursement form will be sent once accepted. Receipts are required with the completed reimbursement form.
