

A Fourth Editor Joins the Editorial Team of the *Canadian Journal of Agricultural Economics*

Cornelis van Kooten, James Nolan and Elwin Smith are pleased to announce a new addition to the journal's editorial staff. Dr. James (Jim) Wilson is Professor of Economics and Management at Université du Québec, Rimouski, and Director of the programs in Maritime Resources Management. Dr. Wilson received his Ph.D. in Agricultural and Resource Economics from Oregon State University, his M.S. in Resource Economics at Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University and the B.S. in Wildlife Biology (marine option) at Texas A&M University. He was formerly Regional Economist for NMFS (Alaska Region) and a Post-doctoral Fellow at the Marine Policy Center, Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution.

Dr. Wilson presently teaches macroeconomics, microeconomics, natural resources and environmental economics, international trade, and econometrics. He is interested in the study and application of different branches of economics to agricultural and resource use issues, including law and economics/institutional economics, evolutionary economics, macroeconomics, international trade, and bio-economics. His published works are usually related to the economics and management of fisheries, aquaculture, and wildlife. Besides serving on this Editorial Board, Dr. Wilson is on the Scientific Advisory Council at Institut Universitaire Européenne de la Mer, Université Bretagne Occidentale, and a member of the Science Advisory Council for Fisheries and Oceans Canada. He has been advisor to different governments and agencies in marine, including NOAA (U.S.), Department of Fisheries and Oceans Canada, FAO, the World Bank, the Inter-American Development Bank, Agence française de développement, and the European Union, as well as the governments of several developing countries.
